#### Introduction: smart phones & the refugee crisis



- Smart phones discovered in the fall of 2015 as a key tool for migrants and refugees, as "more important than food and water"
- New apps and platforms developed to aid refugees
- Volunteer initiatives focusing on providing right infrastructure to refugees: wifi and recharging stations

# What is the digital migrant?

- Digital migrant: using digital tools to find and share relevant information, to communicate with others (other migrants, family members, etc) and thereby producing digital traces and digital profiles.
- Raises the question of how this information may be put to use for other purposes, and what concerns that may create: ethically, legally and in humanitarian terms.



# Smart phones as tool for European authorities - for what purposes?

- Distinguish between two different, although related, potential uses
  - Smart phones to verify migrants and asylum applicants' identity (eg. when lost papers)
  - Smart phones to check if migrants or asylum applicants pose a security threat
- They raise a set of common questions, with the second prospected use raising some additional ones



### The digital device does not lie?

- Reliance on digital device as the "real" reflection of ones identity: the new biometric identity
- Vulnerable persons fleeing wars: what information is there and what is not there on social media and other platforms?
- Ideas about the "smart phone" and actual uses: instances of multiple persons using the same phone



# **Effectiveness**?

- European authorities' "need to use all information available"
- As many tools seeking to control migrants' mobility: they may eventually affect migrants' (and smugglers') behavior



### Power and distrust

- **Compulsory or not:** power relationship between the one claiming an identity and the one checking it
- **Proportionality:** weigh need of intrusive measures against risk of increased distrust between refugees and authorities



# Humanitarian and legal concerns: if failure to protect

- Privacy
- Data protection
- Reliance on possible wrongful or wrongfully interpreted information
- What right to appeal for individuals concerned?
