Application to change date of birth, place of birth and/or citizenship

The purpose of the questions in this form is to collect information that is important to your case. If you do not provide sufficient information, this may affect our assessment of your application. Please answer all questions where relevant.

You must complete this form if one of the following situations applies to you

- You are applying to either renew your residence permit, or for a permanent residence permit or Norwegian citizenship, and wish to change your date of birth, place of birth or citizenship from that currently registered in the National Registry.

What you need to do

You must go in person to the police in the district you live in and submit the form together with the application for a residence permit or Norwegian citizenship.

- You are applying for a residence permit on new grounds and wish to change your date of birth, place of birth or citizenship from that currently registered in the National Registry.

What you need to do

You must go in person to the police in the district you live in and submit the form together with the application for a residence permit.

- You have a residence permit and wish to change your date of birth, place of birth or citizenship from that currently registered in the National Registry.

What you need to do

You must go in person to the police in the district you live in and submit the form.

If you do not take the completed form with you to the police, they will set a deadline for when it must be submitted. You are personally responsible for submitting the form to the police before your case is considered.

You should not complete this form

- if you wish to change your name and have not yet registered the change in the National Registry. In such cases, please complete [the form on this page](#).
- if you have changed your name in the National Registry following an application submitted to the Tax Office. In such cases, please complete the [name change form](#).
- if you are a citizen of [an EU/EEA country](#). In such cases, please [enquire at the Norwegian Tax Administration](#).

Providing incorrect information may be a criminal offence

Providing incorrect information to the immigration authorities may be a criminal offence. If you do not contribute to clarifying the facts of your case, for example if you fail to present travel documents containing your new identity information, this may affect our assessment of your application.
