The employer shall complete the form in three (3) copies, to be distributed as follows:

- Two (2) copies for the applicant
- One (1) copy to be retained by the employer

The employer is required to complete this form if the employer has a place of business in Norway. The employer has a duty of notification in relation to the immigration authorities in accordance with the Immigration Act and the Immigration Regulations.

The form must be completed in full. Please use capital letters.

When registering with the police, you are required to present a copy of this employment certificate or an employment contract that meets the requirements of Section 14-6 of the Working Environment Act.
