Information regarding the processing of personal data in reception centres

Asylum seekers shall be followed up in a good manner.

The reception centre and the UDI can process personal data about you that are necessary in order to

- offer you a place at a reception centre
- ensure that you receive the money you are entitled to
- take good care of unaccompanied minor asylum seekers
- follow you up in a way that is adapted to your situation at the centre where you are staying
- follow you up if your application for protection is rejected and you have to return home.

In order to achieve this, the reception centre, on behalf of the UDI, must register and use certain personal data about you.

When we process your personal data, it takes place within the framework of the laws and regulations that regulate our tasks and duties, namely the Immigration Act, the Public Administration Act, and the Personal Data Act.

The reception centre and the UDI have a duty of secrecy and can only disclose your personal data if it is stated in the law that we can, or if you consent to it.

You can contact the reception centre for further information regarding

- what personal data the centre has registered about you
- where this data were obtained
- how they are used
- how they are secured

You can demand to have incorrect data corrected or deleted. You can also ask the reception centre or the UDI for a transcript of your personal data.
